The Vichitra Veena is an ancient Indian instrument, but every living tradition must also respond to the needs of its time.

The traditional Vichitra Veena is large, heavy and difficult to transport. Its size can make handling, travelling and early learning challenging for many students. To address these practical difficulties, Dr. Radhika Veenasadhika developed the Radhika Model Vichitra Veena.

WHAT IS THE RADHIKA MODEL VICHITRA VEENA?

The Radhika Model, developed by Dr. Radhika Veenasadhika, is a compact and the smallest known model of the Vichitra Veena.

It preserves the essential fretless identity, slide-based playing method, meend and tonal character of the traditional Vichitra Veena. At the same time, its reduced size and weight make it easier to carry, handle, teach and learn.

WHY WAS IT CREATED?

The Radhika Model was created to solve some of the practical difficulties connected with the traditional instrument. Its purpose was not to replace the traditional Vichitra Veena, but to make the instrument more accessible for modern students and performers.

The model was developed through direct experience in performance, teaching, research and instrument design.

MAIN ADVANTAGES

- Compact and the smallest known model
- Smaller in size and lighter in weight
- Easier to carry and handle
- More convenient for classes, demonstrations, recordings and travel
- More approachable for new learners
- Rich, clear and refined tonal quality

TRADITION AND INNOVATION

The musical identity of the Vichitra Veena lies in its fretless structure, continuous swara movement, meend and resonance. These essential qualities remain central to the Radhika Model.

The innovation is mainly in its compact structure, portability, practical handling and accessibility. This shows that tradition and innovation do not need to oppose each other. Thoughtful innovation can help a rare tradition survive and reach future generations.

LEARNING IS NOW EASIER

Earlier, the large size, weight, rarity and limited availability of the instrument made Vichitra Veena learning difficult. The Radhika Model, structured teaching and dedicated institutional work have made the instrument more approachable.

Beginners can now begin learning under proper guidance without first becoming advanced performers of another instrument.

WHO CAN LEARN?

- Beginners
- Children and young learners
- Adults
- Students of Indian classical music
- Vocalists and instrumentalists
- Learners from India and other countries

WHEN CAN ONE BEGIN?

A learner can begin after receiving basic orientation about the instrument, sitting position, handling, mizrab, glass paperweight, basic swara placement and practice discipline.

Learning can begin from the foundation level.

WHERE AND HOW CAN ONE LEARN?

The Vichitra Veena can be learned through qualified teachers and institutions dedicated to the instrument.

- In-person classes
- Guided online classes
- Workshops and camps
- Demonstrations and introductory courses
- Regular practical training

Written material and videos can create awareness, but practical learning requires direct guidance from a teacher.

REMEMBER
